Ensure you have the consent of others before taking and sharing photos or videos.



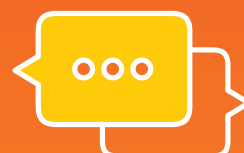
Be part of our community by wearing your college lanyard so we can see it.
